



Outdoor Ed. at Ancrum


CHALLENGE COMPLETE!


The boys even made it into the local paper for their amazing efforts!

The visit allowed our pupils to enhance their knowledge of the nuclear power industry including the day-to-day operation at such a facility. They benefited from a full guided tour of the complex thus enabling them to see what goes on behind the scenes at such an important industrial site. This included the opportunity to visit the purpose-built visitor centre, where the pupils were able to explore, in a fun and interactive way, how electricity is generated.

The visit has helped the pupils to understand further the relationship between Industry and their own classroom learning.
